coordinate soccer games and playoffs between the provincial districts. Since its creation, the Alberta Soccer Association has grown to be the province's largest individual sports association - reaching over 90,000 members. These individuals make up 19 Member Districts and 3 Associate Members across Alberta.

With the goal of serving these Member Districts, Alberta Soccer:

- Promotes participation in, and enhances development of, soccer in Alberta
- Promotes and supports all levels of soccer competition in Alberta including provincial and national selections
- Governs the sport of soccer in Alberta and produces supporting documentation such as policies and by-laws
- Encourages and fosters personal development and training of all players, coaches and referees in the province
- Coordinates provincial festivals, tournaments and cup competitions on an annual basis
- Promotes respect and equality in the game and is inclusive to all members of society
- Provides the necessary means to resolve any internal dispute that may arise between Members, clubs, officials and players of the Alberta Soccer Association.
- Offers health insurance for soccer related incidents to all members.

The Alberta Soccer Association has a \$4,000,000 annual budget with nearly 50% of the annual revenue coming from registration fees paid by each player in the province.

Alberta Soccer Board of Directors Commitments

Mandatory Meetings

- Alberta Soccer Board Meetings
 - o 6 – 8 in person meetings and 2 - 4 conference calls
 - In person meetings are normally held on Saturdays and scheduled at least one month in advance
 - In person meetings include shorter meetings during the Membership meetings identified below
 - Conference calls are no more than two hours on Sunday – Thursday evenings
- Alberta Soccer Membership Meetings
 - o 3 weekends per year
 - Late April – Spring Planning
 - Early November – Fall Planning
 - Late January – Annual General Meeting

Committee Membership

- All Board Members are expected to be active on a minimum of one Governance committee as chair or voting member.
 - o The Governance Committees include;
 - Governance & By-laws, Strategic Planning, Finance, Risk Management and Awards & Recognition
 - Ad-hoc committees as determined by the Board of Directors which currently include;
 - Development of Women in Soccer, Business Development, Harassment & Equity Committee
- Board Members have optional involvement as Board Liaisons to the three operational committees which are;
 - o Technical Development, Competitions, Referee Development
- Committee time commitments vary and Terms of Reference should be reviewed or discussed prior to commitment to a particular committee.

Public Events

- Board Members will be invited to attend various public events hosted by Alberta Soccer, Canada Soccer, our Affiliated Members or Partners and will be expected to attend a minimum of three events annually. Events include, but are not limited to the following;

Communication

- All Board Members should expect to be active on email weekly to monitor Board activity and committee activity.

Minimum Standards

- The Alberta Soccer Board of Directors minimum duties are outlined in the ASA By-laws. Specific attention should be paid to the following sections
 - Article IV.4 – Duties of the Officers
 - Article IV.5 – Obligations and Powers of the Board of Directors
 - Article IV.8 – Board Meetings
- All Board Members will be required to pass a Criminal Record Check to the satisfaction of the Alberta Soccer Volunteer Screening Policy.
- All Board Members will be required to sign the Code of Conduct and Conflict of Interest Policy which include a declaration of professional and soccer affiliations.
