# 1. Executive Director Hiring Committee (Shaun Hammond)

- a) 50 + applications received.
- b) 4 rounds of interviews.
- c) All reference and background checks complete.
- d) New Executive Director is Lisa Grant
  - Starting just after the long weekend in July.
  - 20 + yrs. Alberta Lacrosse Executive Director
  - BA Psychology
  - Well versed in AB sports scene and Covid effects
  - Promoted lacrosse across the Province and Canada.
  - Alberta based (Sherwood Park)
  - Formal announcement to be released soon.
  - First 3 months anticipate she will focus on getting to know the membership and what their priorities are and meeting staff.
  - Richard to assist with transition.

#### 2. Government of Alberta Update (Richard Adams)

- As of May 10, 2021 all sanctioned soccer activity is prohibited in 'High Case Regions'.
  - High Case Regions currently cover 96% of the provincial population.
  - 8 & 2 activities are permitted in low case regions.
  - Return to Train and Modified games documentation has been updated and simplified to be ready for a quick turnaround.
  - Review of status on May 25 at the earliest.
    - Relaunch will now be based on vaccination, hospitalization, and positivity rates.
  - SPAR group is categorizing and grouping similarly structured sports together as
    discussions continue about possible RTP options such as cohorts. This makes more
    sense i.e. aquatics in a different group than field-based sports like soccer.
    - Higher contact sports may have later restart date then low contact sports.

# 3. Canada Soccer Update

- a) Canada Soccer Presidential Update (Shaun Hammond)
  - i. AMM SGM May 1, 2021
    - Short agenda with no controversial items.
    - One bylaw amendment was approved by members about a definition of voting members. Players now have a vote and within that player group the amendment clarifies how the delegates will be selected.

- Second bylaw amendment on the eligibility of Directors. Previously
  minimum of 3 qualified Directors of each gender required, changed to 4
  members who identify as female and 4 members who identify as male.
- Election of Directors:
  - o BC/Yukon Charlie Cuzzetto, re-elected
  - o QC Paul-Claude Berube (only candidate who ran), re-elected.
  - VP Charmaine Crooks.
- 3 independent Directors nominated by the Board and ratified by the members are:
  - o Brittany Tymko Baxter former WNT player
  - o Charisse Bacchus- extensive experience with FIFA
  - Stephanie Geositis Ontario Soccer and Club Experience, Sport Consultant
- 5 of the 14 Directors are now female.
- ii. Canada Soccer 2022-2026 Strategic Plan Survey
  - Members encouraged to participate and share with their members so that the Alberta perspective is well represented.
- b) Nationals
  - i. Club Nationals
    - Alberta Soccer indicated that teams would be interested in participating in Nationals but that a date needs to be set by Canada Soccer for a final decision regarding the competition and the viability of provincial qualification.
      - o There will be no penalty for reversing the decision.
- 4. Operations Updates (Richard Adams)
  - a) Competitions
    - i. Provincials
      - Outdoor Provincials CANCELLED
      - If necessary, qualifications for Nationals will be organized.
      - Some early discussion around possible open registration soccer celebration in the Fall.
        - May be fundraising opportunities for members.
    - ii. Other events
      - AMSL cancelled.
      - AYSL delayed.
    - v. Multi-sport Games
      - Alberta Summer Games- cancelled.
      - North American Indigenous Games (Nova Scotia) Postponed to 2022 at minimum.
      - Arctic Winter Games (Wood Buffalo) Postponed to Jan/Feb 2023.
      - Canada Summer Games (Niagra, ON) August 2022

## b) Referee (Dave O'Neill)

- i. Referee Registration Update
  - Stagnated since initial surge.
    - 687 registered (not Minis)
      - 480 of those have completed online modules.
      - 434 have attended refresher webinar (19 so far) and need only attend COVID Protocols video when ready to be eligible.
    - No more refresher webinars will take place until after May 25<sup>th</sup> at the earliest, when more uptake expected especially if re-start announced/anticipated.
    - o Of 1293 potential Mini renewals, 79 have registered.
      - Low numbers expected as it has been 2 years. since last time they could register.
      - 40 of those have completed questionnaire and need to attend COVID webinar when ready to be eligible.
  - 41 Entry Level students are fully graduated, 53 still need to complete graduation step.
    - o Practical sessions have been postponed due to restrictions.
    - 102 students need to attend those and then they will be eligible.
  - 45 students registered for upcoming Entry Level courses.
  - Of 1293 potential Mini renewals, 79 have registered.
    - 40 of those have completed questionnaire and need to attend COVID Protocols video when ready to be eligible.
  - 50% fee structure has resulted in \$19,000+ savings for referees out of Heritage Fund.
- ii. Referee Town Hall
  - May 27
  - Referees & Cohorts discussion
    - 1 Official system for outdoor in development.
    - 2 Official option available.
  - Contact Dave if you want a link for the meeting.
- c) Technical (Matt Thomas/Richard Adams)
  - a. Town Hall Meeting April 28
    - 75 attendees
      - Went into greater detail on some of the topics being talked about in this meeting.
  - b. Provincial Licensing
    - 11 Clubs have applied since soft opening.
    - Deadline remains September 2022 (as per motion by ASA membership)
      - New deadline from Canada Soccer today, start of Outdoor 2023 season so this could be revisited by membership this Fall.

- c. Coaching Certification
  - NCCP Grassroots Workshops
    - Old courses (free)
      - Coaches have until June 1st to complete before the google classroom closes.
      - Must re-start if not completed in full by the deadline.
      - Please check weekly lists that Claire is sending out to ensure your coaches get reminders if you notice they have not completed their course.
    - New Courses
      - First round of Heritage Fund support has been distributed to members.
        - 95 Courses refunded (as of May 7). Another 100 have come in since then.
      - Application for up front funding due by end of May.
  - Licensing Courses
    - Next C License starting this weekend 57 coaches registered.
    - Next ASA hosted course will be in November, but members may request their own courses at anytime.
    - C & B License Evaluations for Trained coaches now open for registration.
      - Submitted by PowerPoint presentation, not video recordings/in person at this time.
    - Reminder that Licenses now expire after 3 years renewal methods will vary to ensure all coaches can be accommodated (i.e. in person, video, etc.)
      - A & B National Licenses renewal must be done through Canada Soccer directly.
      - C & B Provincial currently managed by Alberta Soccer.
    - Claire and Matt can assist as required.
      - Some perception that new renewal requirement seems like a money grab to some.
      - Difficult for volunteer coaches to manage time and cost.
    - Alberta Soccer will look at either cost neutral or free of charge for C License renewals.

- Some coaches who certified in 2015 are attending the upcoming C licence course for no cost to complete their renewal.
- Canada Soccer still to release their renewal fee schedule and process soon.
- Impact on Licensing coaches and Provincial standards on members is difficult.
- Licensing committee is looking at how timelines could be adjusted to ease the impact on individual coaches and make it easier.
  - Time commitment decreased to 1.5 3 hrs in person vs 3.5 16 hours in person, the rest completed online at the coach's discretion.
- d) Admin (Richard Adams)
  - a. Finance 2021 Outdoor Fees
    - Fee reduction confirmed based on the 2020 fees but accounting for Canada Soccer increase to the regular fee of \$9 pp.
      - U5 remains at pre-COVID rate of \$6 pp.
    - Fee schedule will be sent out shortly.
  - b. Finance 2020-2021 Indoor Reporting
    - 21 Districts reporting to date.
    - Showing more then 66% drop from initial registration to participation.
    - 25,000 players registered but only 33% of those participated or had the opportunity to play.
  - c. Finance Emergency Covid Funding Support
    - \$179.400 in new funding.
      - Equal distribution amongst members \$7800 per organization.
      - Details will be confirmed by Jeannie Hawksworth.
      - No restrictions on applications connected to SMERG.
    - Small Medium Enterprise Relaunch Grant (SMERG)
      - New round of \$10,000 per organization.
  - d. Governance Structure and EDI Strategy
    - Status
      - Initial review of 3 vendors complete.
      - Additional \$25, 000 required based on current bids.
    - Board of Directors would like to pause the project pending the re-start of competitive play.
      - The Board is committed to this project and believes in the value it will bring to our governance and inclusion structures.
      - The majority of the members agreed with the Board (only one dissent via email to ED) so the project will be paused pending soccer re-start.

- d. Return to Play Campaign
  - Final logo approved.
  - Toolkits ready for deployment
    - Will hold off until soccer re-launches in the most positive time so investment better – could be as late August/September.
    - Needs to be done when it will have the biggest impact.
- e. Committee Volunteers
  - Committee chairs will be contacting potential members soon.
  - Central Registration Committee is already active.
  - Competitions Committee may not meet as soon time due to the inactivity and cancellation of Outdoor provincials.
- f. Low-income fee waiver
  - AGM questions (EMSA) about fee waiver for low-income participation.
  - Survey will be distributed to members to gather data.
- g. Alberta Soccer Office
  - Staff continue to work remotely.
    - Microsoft Teams phone system now active.
  - Moving to Percy Page Center until the Fall at minimum.

    - Rent free at this time.
