

# Promotional Criteria and Checklists for Referees (Regional to Provincial)

A career planning tool for Referees in Alberta

This document is designed to outline the pathway to promotion as a referee in Alberta. The process is largely self-directed. In other words, the referee has to take charge of his/her development and seek opportunities to achieve his/her developmental goals. The criteria and checklists below are tools for referees to use in their development plans.

# **REGIONAL to PROVINCIAL Referee**

To be <u>eligible to upgrade</u> from Regional to Provincial referee, you must:

- Be a Regional referee in the season that you apply for upgrading.
- Have refereed games at the competitive U15 level or above. 'Competitive' is any Tier that leads to provincials (T1-T4) or 'Standards Based' youth leagues (e.g. AYSL).
- Have successfully passed the fitness test at the Regional level or higher, in the season prior to applying.
- Submit an application form to the Alberta Soccer Association, prior to the annual deadline. (See next page for link) (<u>Provincial Upgrade</u> application deadline – February 29<sup>th</sup>, 2024– 6:00PM)

Please note – this is a competitive process, and not all applicants may be selected by the RDT.

To be <u>successfully upgraded</u> to Provincial referee, you must:

- Attend a Provincial Training Course. (additional details below)
- Pass a multiple-choice Laws of the Game examination, with a mark of 80% or better.
- Pass the FIFA Hi Intensity Fitness test, at the male or female provincial standard. (details below)
- Referee in a minimum of 20 qualifying games (competitive U15 and above). You will be asked to submit a log of your games to the Alberta Soccer Association, prior to October 31<sup>st</sup>.
- Work as an assistant referee in a minimum of 5 qualifying games (competitive U15 and above). You will be asked to submit a log of your games to the Alberta Soccer Association, prior to October 31<sup>st</sup>.
- Achieve a minimum of 3 assessments with an above average mark (8.5 or higher), as a referee over the 20 qualifying games, in the year of upgrading. Assessments are reviewed by the Referee Development Team at the conclusion of the outdoor season.

A decision will be made regarding the referee's status by December 15<sup>th</sup>.

### Details for provincial upgrade clinics:

There are two methods of entering the Provincial Upgrade Program:

### 1. Centralized CSA Training Course (held at CSA location)

- a. Targeted towards officials on the path towards the National List of Officials. Special consideration will be given to officials, nominated by their Provincial Association for the National List of Officials, who have attended the CSA's Centralized In-service Training Course.
- b. Must apply to Provincial Association, no later than February 29<sup>th</sup>
- c. Nominated to CSA by the Provincial Association, no later than April 1<sup>st</sup>.
- d. Must successfully complete an online Laws of the Game examination, with a mark of at least 80%, prior to attending the Training Course. This is one-time examination, with no re-takes.
- e. Must successfully complete the FIFA Hi Intensity Fitness Test at the provincial standard, prior to May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024.

## 2. Provincial Training Course (held in Alberta)

- a. Targeted towards officials with skills to meet the requirements of a Provincial Referee but are not on the promotional stream to become National or International officials.
- b. Must apply to the Provincial Association, no later than February 29<sup>th</sup>
- c. Successfully selected by the Provincial Association, no later than April 1<sup>st</sup>.
- d. Must successfully complete an online Laws of the Game examination, with a mark of at least 80%.
- e. Must successfully complete the FIFA Hi Intensity Fitness Test at the provincial standard, by June 30th, in the year of the upgrade.
- f. The cost to attend the Provincial Training Course held in Alberta is \$183.75 (inc. GST)

Selections to attend either course will be made by the Alberta Soccer Referee Development Committee, no later than April 1<sup>st</sup>.

#### Fitness Test Standards:

FIFA Hi Intensity Fitness Test (Interval) – Provincial Referee Standard		
Gender	Sprints	Interval Run
Male	6.4 sec	15/20 sec/ 4000 M
Female	6.8 sec	17/22 sec/ 4000 M
